PETALING JAYA: Walk instead of drive for short distances as this will go a long way in caring for the environment, popular TV3 presenter Karam Singh Walia said.

"When a car is driven for a short time, it will not burn fuel as efficiently as when it is driven long distance on a highway," he said

said.
"The failure to address environmental issues is due to the perception that nature is someone else's problem, said Karam, 50, when met at Sri Pentas in Bandar Utama here yesterday.

Other TV3 personalities – Shahida Azad Jamaludin, Gina Woon and Sasha Bashir – agreed with Karam that the key to protecting nature was for people to have the environment close to their hearts and to start practising small but meaningful acts in

their daily lives.
