He said nature was unique as it changed every second, depending on the sunlight, weather and other elements.

"I see nature with my mind's eye and capture the most beautiful moments to share with the others. Behind every painting, there is a message," he said.

Art teacher Rafie said he would bring his students for outdoor activities, encouraging them to draw nature while providing knowledge on preserving the environment.

He hoped the exhibition would serve its purpose and help raise awareness.
