Sabahan researcher wins Tokyo award

KOTA KINABALU: Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM) Researcher, Dr Kevin Ng from Sabah has won the Japan International Award 2009 for Young Agricultural Researchers at University of Tokyo, Japan.

Ng, 34, who joined FRIM in August 1999 after graduating from Universiti Malaysia Sabah (UMS) works at the FRIM Biotechnology Division Genetics Laboratory.

He was one of the three recipients of the award this year selected for his exemplary performance and innovative research achievements in the field of spatial structure and impact on logging on genetic diversity of selected tropical tree species.
