200 trees planted to celebrate Earth Day

PETALING JAYA: Some 60 people celebrated Earth Day by planting 200 trees at the Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM).

Saplings of the *meranti temak nipis* species were planted at Field 53 of FRIM's Bukit Hari experimental site under the institute's tree planting programme yesterday.

"We planted this species and other selected trees as our contribution to the maintenance of their population," said FRIM director-general Datuk Dr Abd Latif Mohmod.

The participants consisted of employees from KL Convention Centre, representatives of Baker Hughes Drilling System, along with the general public.

The meranti temak nipis provides durable timber and can be found in Langkawi, Perlis and parts of Kedah, but is considered to be an endangered species by the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN).

FRIM corporate management unit head Norhayati Nordin believed conservation efforts would increase through the programme.

"There is no better way to celebrate Earth Day than to help green the Earth," she said.
