Talk on secret sex life of Malaysian orchids

KUCHING: A public awareness talk on the secret sex life of Malaysian orchids captured on camera will be held at Sarawak Biodiversity Centre (SBC) on Friday June 29.

The presentation will not be X-rated as the speaker Ong Poh Teck will be talking on why orchids are so diverse in their shape, colour, size and scent,

and more importantly, how they pollinate, said a press statement yesterday.

Using orchids found in Peninsular Malaysia as references, Ong will talk about how orchids are largely dependent on their incestuous counterpart for reproduction in the wild, aside from a few orchids species which selfpollinate.
