## Council teams up with MACC and Sirim

AIM: Shah Alam City Council to learn from MACC and Sirim about anti-corruption methods and total quality management

HAH Alam City Council (MB-SA) is collaborating with Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) and Sirim Bhd to fight corruption and obtain Sirim Total Quality Management (TQM) accreditation by November.
