## SSPCA to host inaugural international symposium

KUCHING: 'Pets, Strays and KUCHING: 'Pets, Strays and the City' is the theme for the international symposium that the Sarawak Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SSPCA) is holding here on Oct 1.

Held for the first time, this symposium is organised in conjunction with World Animal Day which is celebrated every Oct 4 and the World Animal Groove (WAG) Music Festival.

According to a press release, the one-day symposium which will be held at the Borneo Convention Centre Kuching, will have two keynote addresses and four talk sessions and expected to attract some 200 delegates.

Among the speakers for the talk are World Society for the Protection of Animals, Thailand executive director Natasha Lee; SPCA Selangor chairman Christine Chin, Forest Research Institute Malaysia head of Zoology Mohd Shafiz Azman, and National Parks Board, Singapore representative Cheryl Chia.

Other events held during the WAG Music Festival include the 10-km Animazing Race, WAG Bazaar, Wiggle Waggle Walk, pet blessings and music concert.
