Worldwide initiative started in 1991 with one million trees planted across 10 countries

EON planted its 10th million tree under its Aeon Hometown Forests Program recent-

The worldwide initiative was started in 1991 by the Aeon Environmental Foundation which saw a total of one million people planting trees on the premises of Aeon stores and other areas across 10 countries — Australia, Cambodia, China, Indonesia, Japan, Kenya, Laos, Thailand, Vietnam, and Malaysia.

To herald the opening of the new Aeon Mall in Kulaijaya in November, an additional 9,027 trees were planted together with 800 participants from all walks of life.

These included schoolchildren, members of the local community, government agencies, university students and Aeon business partners. Guest of honour at the event was Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Mohamed Khaled Nordin.

More than 65 species of trees and shrubs were planted in order to maintain and preserve the ecosystem in the area.

Themed "10 million trees wth

customers," the tree planting festival kicked off at Aeon Mall Tsukuba in Japan in March, and over the list few months was extended to many other countries.

In Malaysia, the first tree under the Aeon Hometown Forests Pogram was planted at Aeon Malacca Shopping Centre in 1991 when the store first opened.

Trees like gaharu, saga, tualang and cengkih were selected because these were the native trees of the region.

"Today, we are proud to annource that Aeon Malaysia has planted over 450,000 trees throughout Malaysa," said Aeon Co (M) Bhd managing lirector Nur Qamarina Chew at the tree planting session in Aeon Iulaijaya.

The foundation started hosting tree-planting initiatives in the ealy 90's to restore forests that have ben damaged by natural disasters.

One of the foundation's initiaties was the implementation of the Grat Wall Tree Planting project in Beijng from 1998 to 2010 which had 15,000 volunteers from Japan and Chia

planting 10 million trees.

During the Great East Jap'n Earthquake, the trees planted uner the Aeon Hometown Forests help'd lessen the damage of some of he Aeon stores by blocking floating na-

terials from the tsunami.

"With the world's forests being destroyed by man and natural disasters, a harmonious coexistence between nature and man has become a global challenge. Realising this, we at Aeon are determined to continue our tree planting efforts to ensure mother natures is safe for the future," said Nur Qamarina.

Together with the Forest Research Institution of Malaysia (FRIM), Aeon has also unveiled a new Aeon Educational Forest area.

This is located at the shopping centre itself and designed for children and students to explore, research and learn about the various forests and fruit trees as well as herbal plants.

"We hope to make people more aware of the importance of preserving nature," she said.
