## Frim researcher wins coveted

## Tokto award

KUALA LUMPUR; Forest Research Institute Malaysia (FRIM) researcher Dr Tnah Lee Hong received the prestigious Japanese International Award for Young Agricultural Researchers 2013.

FRIM in a statement today said the Japanese Agriculture, Forestry and Fisheries Ministry had selected the 32year-old Tnah for her outstanding research achievements, where the awarding ceremony would be held in

Tokyo, Japan on Nov 20.

Tnah, who works at the FRIM Biotechnology Division Genetic Laboratory, was selected for her research on timber tracking system of an important timber species (Chengal) or Neobalanocarpus heimii DNA (Dipterocarpaceae) using approach.

"She was also a recipient of the International Union of Forest Research Organisations (IUFRO) Student Award for Excellence in Forest Sciences at the XXII IUFRO World Congress in 2010," it
