Malaysia keen to tap lucrative agarwood mart

MALAYSIA is keen to tap the lucrative agarwood market as it has the potential to contribute significantly to the country's economy, said Natural Resources and Environment Minister Datuk Seri Dr Wan Junaidi Tuanku Jaafar.

"The international trade in agarwood involves hundreds of tonnes worth millions of US dollars annually," he said at the second International Scientific Symposium on Agarwood yesterday.
